Shepherd Program

Here's a shout out for our amazing Shepherd Program that has been operating since the 1980s. The Shepherd Program is an Outreach ministry that provides people with rides to medical appointments when they, because of a medical or physical condition, are unable to drive themselves and have no other means of transportation.

Currently we have 3 administrators and 22 drivers. All are volunteers. The program is free of charge to the riders. Sometimes the riders or their families make contributions to the church in support of the program, which allows us to offer our drivers occasional gift gas cards. This year, from January 1st through November 30th, the program has provided 99 rides totaling 3,312.5 miles (round trip).

What is a Charitable IRA Deduction?

Have you already reached the age (currently 70 ½ years) when you are required to take a Minimum Required Distribution (MRD) from your IRA?

A Charitable IRA Deduction is a special provision allowing a taxpayer to transfer an amount up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA accounts directly to a qualifying charity. (Yes, our beloved church is a qualifying charity, but you already knew that!) The distribution will count toward the taxpayer's yearly Minimum Required Distribution and will not be treated as taxable income. You do not have to itemize on your tax return to gain this tax benefit. This can be a win-win situation for both you and the recipient of your generosity.

In order to take advantage of this tax benefit, the distribution <u>must</u> be made directly to the charity from the IRA custodian. Our very capable assistant Treasurer, Julie Kessler, will provide you with a donation letter to keep with your tax papers.

If this sounds like something you would like to investigate, your financial/tax advisor or IRA custodian will be able to answer your questions and give you directions on how to proceed.

FCCW Men's Fellowship 2019 Annual Report

2019 was the first full year of operation for our FCCW Men's Fellowship Group. We have about 20 active members with more joining us every month and we dedicate ourselves to fellowship and serving our members in need along with community folks needing help of all kinds.

During 2019 we have raised enough funds to purchase new night lights for our FCCW Bell Choir, new strong yet portable tables for fellowship hall, provide \$1500 in youth scholarships for the UCC Horton Center Mountaintop Camp and mulch for the grounds surrounding the church. We also painted the interior of a needy member's home, provided fall yard work for elderly members, raised funds doing yard work in the community, grilled dogs/burgers to raise funds during the yard sale, made safety repairs to elderly members homes and the Interim Pastors' residence.

On Memorial Day we placed new American flags on the graves of all the war veterans buried in Lovell Cemetery. We have linked with the Sunday School Rock Star kids through music with Buddy Dee leading our musical talents singing with them during church services. We've also bought the Sunday School an electronic keyboard for expanding their musical program in the curriculum and for musical pageants they perform.

The Men's' Fellowship meets both at the Pub's Back Room and at members' homes for good food, fellowship and service within the church and greater Wakefield Community. Maximum class size: 10 (If more are interested we can create another class date and time to be offered)

Certification: Upon completion of this course, students receive an American Heart Association Heartsaver CPR/AED e-Card via email. e-Cards are valid for two years. e-Cards are issued 1-2 business days after course completion
