THE PASTOR'S PAGE

See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.' Luke 7: 27b NRSV

Intentional Interims are the messengers who come after the installed pastor's tenure has concluded. We come to help the church prepare to call the next installed pastor.

During this interim time the intentional interim facilitates the grief work, inviting people to acknowledge their anxiety, anger and even remorse; listening to as many voices as possible to discover the congregation's pulse beat and the unwritten agendas; hearing the nature and mission of the church-what makes this church stand out in the community?; ears open for the new voices waiting for the space to rise up, speak and even lead-identify new and emerging lay leaders; provide new options for ministry and worship-the priest and the prophet; lifting up unresolved conflict for reconciliation and a new understanding of roles and relationships; reacquainting the congregation on what it means to partner with your pastor for ministry.

The recommended duration for an interim is one month for every year of the installed pastor's tenure. My covenant agreement with FCCW was for at least 18 months. You partnered with me. You trusted me with your history and dreams; with your hearts and desires; with your anger and doubts; with your tears of joy and grief.

Your Profile Committee has completed their task and have been released from their duties. Your Search and Call Committee is receiving profiles and starting interviews.

I came to prepare the way before you to call your next long-term settled pastor. I have completed my call.

On May 16th I met with the Diaconate Ministry and announced I have received a call from a church in Vermont as their Intentional Interim. My covenant agreement indicates 60 days' notice is needed to terminate the call. I asked for the 60-day notice to be waived to allow FCCW to begin their new fiscal year budget without the pastoral costs of a fulltime intentional interim. My request was accepted and my last day with this Body of Christ will be June 30th.

I thank God for you because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world and for a little while, I was your pastoral partner during the "in-between" time and during the "great pause."

Plans are being made to provide preaching and pastoral care while you remain in the search and call process. It is my plan to organize coverage for July and August. The Diaconate Ministry will be provided persons they can reach out to for "emergency" pastoral support and digital pulpit supply.

The Diaconate Ministry is planning to host a Zoom Exit Interview. This exit interview is not to evaluate my ministry practice. Our final time together is to allow you an opportunity to appreciate/ brag about how the interim period has allowed you to raise above limited potentials held (this is the meaning of R.A.L.P.H. Coaching Ventures LLC). It is our final appreciative inquiry session. It is not in homes as "Cottage Meetings," but together on Zoom. My hope is you will remind one another of the "new thing" you heard/realized God is doing in your midst.

In order to facilitate an orderly Zoom meeting, please send your responses to the statement: I saw myself raise above limited potentials held with/by/ in______ during our interim period." Progress Report from your Search and Call Committee

Since the five of us were named to the, Search and Call Committee we have been meeting at least once a week to prepare to select a candidate to become our new Settled Pastor.

We started by meeting with Pastor Alberta to learn the essence of the procedure that we would follow. We have met with her several times and in addition we met with Reverend Slater from the UCC Office twice. The term meeting has changed considerably since the advent of the Covid 19 Pandemic and the word Zoom has taken on new meaning. We are moving as fast as health and the Holy Spirit will allow.

The Profile Team prepared a Profile of our Church. It was approved and it went live on April 24th. We began receiving profiles from prospective ministers during the first week in May, and we quickly received several. It is no doubt that the Profile Committee did an excellent job.

In the meanwhile we have had training for interviewing

,tracking, and evaluating candidates. We have spent much time developing questions and techniques to use in the interview process.

We will soon begin interviewing candidates. This is a long prayerful process. We are in Covenant with the UCC to follow a certain process.

We had a recent request for shelf stable milk. When you do your next food shopping, please check to see if your preferred grocery store has this item. Hannaford usually carries it next to the soy and almond milk shelf (I believe it is in the same aisle as coffee and tea).

You can drop off your donations any day, by putting them in the outside drop box at the rear of the Food Pantry. You can also drop your donations off when the Food Pantry is open on Wednesdays, 10-1 and 5-7.

Zimbabwe News

Medical supplies (including three wheelchairs and a dozen crutches), school supplies, reading books, children's Bibles and boxes of theological books, clothing galore, more shoes than I can count, dozens of jars of peanut butter, 250 or more athletic uniforms of various sports, basketballs, soccer balls, nets, cleats, garden supplies including two lawn mowers, furniture, 750 dresses (Dress A Girl Program from three sewing groups), toys, hand crafted dolls, a sewing machine, linens, blankets, two welding machines and a free standing jig saw will begin the journey to Zimbabwe in the next few days. This is quite an undertaking. All of this is due to bountiful item donations and countless volunteers who helped sort, tightly pack and seal, invoice and ultimately transport and load these goods in a 40' shipping container in Rochester. Our items will join the donations of 16 other groups representing VT, NH, and MA and will take anywhere from 10-12 weeks to arrive in Zimbabwe.

Cold weather has brought an early start to winter there. Inflation is pegged at more than 750% and prices rise daily. The government instituted a price freeze to offset the rising prices thus mealie meal, the staple food to make sadza, could not be found in Chipinge and many, many other towns this week. Retailers can't afford to loose money on items so they are taken from the shelves and make their way to the "parallel market." The government received humanitarian aid and announced distribution of stipends to all citizens (an amount equivalent to \$6 US) yet weeks later distribution still hasn't taken place. Zimbabweans are in the 15th week of a stay at home order. People are starving and 80% of children are malnourished so people disobey the order and try to avoid police as they look for "piece jobs" to buy whatever they can find to feed themselves and their families. PKZ has people sewing masks using material and sewing machines from the last container. PKZ is also working on a food security program for the most disadvantaged but the absence of mealie meal is making that difficult.

Our gifts from the container show Zimbabweans that they are not forgotten, that they are not alone, that Christians 10,000 miles away care and extend the hand of love and friendship in their time of need. God bless you for your support and participation in this important endeavor.


