Words from the Moderator

In her July 9th devotion, the Rev. Martha Spong refered to Exodus 3:5 in which God tells Moses to take off his sandals because he is standing on holy ground. She writes,

"I have stood in church and felt the presence of God, and I have slipped off my shoes there because I knew we stood on holy ground. I have experienced the charge of the Spirit in a sanctuary full of singers, in the testimony of another, in shared confessions of sin, in vows of commitment, in stirring proclamation, in profound and potent silence."

She goes on to lament our mutual inability to experience these things during this time of Pandemic.

"Of course, I know God speaks in places that are not church, and when [we] set aside [our] longing for what [we] cannot have right now... we might tend to go, to open ourselves up to go where God might be."

I, too, lament not being able to sense the Holy surrounded by my church family. I miss touch and the sense of inclusion. I miss singing! But I am ever impressed with how we, as a congregation, have been able to care for each other in other ways. I love to see our church family members during our virtual worship services. Although the singing isn't quite the same when I'm alone, it's still lifting voice to God and it still feels good to do so.

The Leadership Council met on July 15th to consider the re-opening of church and will do so again every 2 months during this Pandemic. Following are our decisions:

- We agreed that we are not ready to open our building for worship services.
- We agreed that we are safest offering virtual services at this time.
- We agreed to continue allowing the use of our building to small groups such as Care Givers and Grief Support with certain restrictions and safety procedures.
- We agreed to open the building to Hazel MacBrien Nursery School with restrictions and safety procedures.
- We charged our Safe Church Team to ensure that each group understands and agrees to our restrictions and procedures.

Restrictions will apply to <u>everyone</u> entering the building, and there will be signs posted in various locations to help us all remember. Please, everyone, follow the guidelines without exception. Our mutual well-being is at stake. <u>Please refer to the Safe Church report in this Steeple Views edition.</u>

I am simply in awe over how FCCW members have come together, lifted their gifts and carry on, relying on each other to do the same. Surely, we are finding Holy Ground.

May the Holy Spirit continue to move through our congregation, and may we continue to live and love through the Grace of God. Amen.

FCCW BUILDING USE REGULATIONS DURING PANDEMIC CREATED AND APPROVED BY LEADERSHIP COUNCIL ON JULY 26, 2020 ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS MAY BE CHANGED AT ANYTIME DEPENDING ON THE PRO-GRESS OF THIS PANDEMIC AND CHANGES IN CDC RECOMMENDATION AND /OR STATE AND COUNTY REGULATIONS.

BUILDING USE REGULATIONS

A. Sign-in sheets will be placed at each entrance of the Church building. All who enter will sign in and complete with phone number, name, date and time in. This is to allow a means of tracking and contacting anyone who might be at risk if someone does come down with COVID.

B. Signs will be placed at all entrances stating that masks MUST be worn in the building at all times. See "Room Usage B" below. Also, hand sanitizer must be used before entering the common areas of the Church such as stairways, hallways, elevator, sanctuary, kitchens and restrooms.

C. All entrances will be set up with sign-in sheets, masks, gloves, hand sanitizer, and wipes and covered foot activated trash baskets.

D. The CLA Office and Pastor's Study are not to be entered without express permission of the CLA until further notice. A hand sanitizing small table will be placed outside of those offices for people with permission to enter.

ROOM USAGE REGULATIONS

A. Coordinators of the groups and ministries will have sign-in sheets for the persons that are attending the meeting. These forms should be turned in daily to the CLA mailbox.

B. Group leaders and Ministry Coordinators will require all persons to wear a mask in the common areas of the Church. Once in the designated area, masks maybe removed if social distancing can be maintained.

C. Group leaders and Ministry Coordinators must clean (or designate someone) to clean and sanitize rooms used and bathrooms used.

Please wipe down doors, door handles, tables and surfaces that were touched during the meeting. Cleaning materials will be available on a small table in each room. If supplies run low, please send an email to Building and Grounds Co-ordinator.

D. Groups and Ministries should only be using the Sanctuary level restroom. The two restrooms at the back of the Fellowship Hall are designated EXCLUSIVELY for HMNS and only when HMNS is in session. HMNS will leave those restrooms sanitized each day.

E. Restroom should be cleaned and wiped down after each group uses the Church. Procedures to be posted. Cleaning supplies will be in a clearly marked container.

F. Masks are not required to be worn in the Sanctuary during the taping of online services. Please maintain social distancing.

\$2,445 Raised Through On-line Sales in July Alone

Our FUNdraising and Endowment Teams have joined efforts to address our very serious intention of not only raising the \$9000 needed for our projected church budget, but also to meet our Endowment Fund goals as rapidly as possible. This is a challenging year in many ways. Our summer Yard Sale is usually one of our biggest fund raisers. (It is also one of the most physically demanding.) But because we are now living with Covid restrictions, we decided to increase our on-line sales making a virtual yard sale that would continue throughout the year. The donations have been very generous!

People have been cleaning houses and garages. Some more profitable donations have been offered with a percentage given to the church. One \$2600 item was tithed. Others high end items have been offered at 50/50. Most are coming in with full donation going to the church.

I have to say this has been fun! Infused with new energy and more folk willing to help, we have been able to represent our church with a much larger reach. And just like yard sales, when someone finds something they love at a good price, they leave with smiles upon their faces.
