#### **FCCW's Next Adventures!**

Just think, we are on the cusp of some new beginnings at FCCW! Our culture and Covid has brought many changes. There's a new "church landscape" out there bright with possibilities. How can we best seize opportunities to make us an even more Vital, Vibrant, and Thriving community of people who care for each other and our "neighbor" through God's compassionate Love? We need to make decisions about technology and outreach, faith formation for kids (little ones through at least high school), music, etc. I know, I KNOW that if in processes of prayer--we ask for, listen, discern, and share we will receive the Divine's plan for FCCW! I mean, why do things that would be dead-ends, detours, a waste of time and resources? Let see what God's design is for us!

This is how we can begin—and it's based on research! "The more emphasis a congregation gives to...personal religious practices, the higher the congregation's vitality and the more likely it is to be growing in membership." Churches who are the most 'full of life' engage in: 1) "Moral" things like hospitality to all, justice, stewardship, etc.; 2). Spiritual Exercises both at home and communally. WHY? In order to deepen their connection with God and develop personal Christian maturity. This is why I offer the REFLECTION time after the Sermon. 3) They don't cast everything in stone—they can adapt the ways they "eat, meet, greet" and meditate.\*

For this reason, I would like to see us go into processes of DISCERNMENT. The root of this word means to "sort out". We earnestly ask God's Spirit what and how is the best way for FCCW to proceed and listen for the answers, not only in prayer, but throughout our activities as we do them with a sense of presence, mindfulness—looking for God's guidance and confirmations. Discernment is a skill within prayer that can be developed—YAY!!

We can learn to warm the heart and stand in ready expectation. Prayer is a RELATIONSHIP with God, not the conceptual "thinking about God." Discernment teaches us how to pray in, with, and through the Holy Spirit, who...quickens, warms, and enlightens us. This warming the heart is...the work...to pray always. \*\*

True discernment requires inner listening—a skill we can learn. YES! We CAN learn to quiet our minds—for at least a few seconds at a time. Those are spaces in which Spirit can get through to us. You can practice through the day—just by becoming aware of your breathing! Since we do that, oh what, 8-12 times per minute, we have LOTS of opportunities to practice and to let go of judgement of how we're doing. CAUTION, THIS CAN BE a TRAP--another opportunity for you to Judge yourself. STOP IT! NOT ALLOWED!! And, it's a wonderful opportunity to FORGIVE YOURSELF and KEEP PRACTICING. Whoa, quite the spiritual discipline, eh! YAY!

Then there is also a brilliant thing called Meditation or Centering Prayer. It's a time where you can just sit and practice this *awareness exercise* for 20 minutes (or whatever). Again, in the Christian, this is a time of Prayer which is a Relationship with God. And, it's also been referred to as a discipline. One who is devoted to Awareness and becoming more Loving knows s/he needs practice in creating those quiet spaces. So, we learn to use an inner muscle that wants God's Highest and Best, for us. So, a) we realize we're doing "monkey mind"—leaping from thought to thought while holding on for dear life to thoughts (obsession or compulsion □ and then, b) we learn to simply "let go" and return to our breath or a sacred word. That's how "simple" meditative awareness is—and how difficult! The best news is, because God loves us so much, we receive gifts, blessings along the way to help us.

Oh, how can I inspire you to want to learn discernment and these awareness practices which help us to listen?! It is such rich, important work that will RENEW our lives individually as well as communally as a church!

And, you see, you will be learning a process you can also <u>use</u> <u>for yourself</u>. You will be transforming into a "new creature", growing in spiritual maturity rooted in love which only serves you, let's see, only about EVERY minute of the day, LOL!!!

On the practical side, let me suggest one time to meet. Mondays at 4:45 for 45 minutes until 5:30. Let's have other times, as well. Perhaps Sunday? Another day? I'm praying that a curious kernel of people in this congregation will be prompted to take this 1<sup>st</sup> step into discovering God's plan for us.

Spirit, please use these words to inspire these good people. Amen.

#### **News from Zimbabwe**



Thank you, thank you, thank you, thank you for the donation of all that peanut butter! This is going to make a significant difference to the children at the Daisy Dube Home and to other recipients who are lacking in protein! The

plan is to load more than 320 cubic feet of donated goods on two trailers on Sunday or Monday Aug. 29/30 made possible by Brian Shipley and Mark Evenson! The loading with the 18 other groups will take place on Tuesday, Aug. 31st from 9-noon at Spaulding High School.

As of this writing Zimbabwe has had approximately 93,500 cases of covid with 2870 deaths reported. Zimbabwe's population is approximately 15,000,000. The delta variant is running rapid these days and the numbers are increasing significantly. We received a special prayer request from UCCZ President Rev. John Matiza coming via our NH Ukama Chairperson, Rev. David Keller. Many UCCZ churches are reporting heart breaking deaths of their members.

These numbers are considered to be significantly under reported as many people are not diagnosed and some deaths are reported as malaria, pneumonia, or other causes. There is much superstition surrounding Covid-19 and immunizations particularly in the rural areas. Now anyone who wants a vaccination can receive one if they live close to a vaccination center or are willing to walk long distances to get vaccinated. The UCCZ attributes more Covid cases due to attendance at funerals where large groups of people are expected to pay cultural respect to the deceased and to their families.

You shall meet Samuel Khumbula soon! Sam is scheduled to arrive at Logan on Friday, Aug. 13th (speaking of superstitions...) and he is widely excited to meet everyone at FCCW on the 15th.
