IS JESUS CALLING?

What if, in this New Year, you wanted to make changes in your thinking? You would need something to encourage you, right? Well, I found a wonderful little book in Denver when I was ministering in Wyoming. I was led to this one. When I first saw it, I thought, "I suppose this is just another religious-oriented daily devotional" (which I don't tend to enjoy). I felt led to look at it, anyway. I read a page....... "WOW, this is different!! It's speaking to me. It's opening my eyes to ways I stop myself from allowing God into my life! It is helping me to sense Jesus' presence! Yay....Let's see if it hits my people like this!" (It Did.) Here's a sample for you.

Welcome problems as **perspective-lifters**. My children, you tend to sleepwalk through your day until you bump into an obstacle that stymies you. If you encounter a problem with no immediate solution, your response to that situation will take you either up or down. You can lash out at the difficulty, resenting it and feeling sorry for yourself. This will take you down into a pit of self-pity.

Alternatively, the problem can be a ladder, enabling you to climb up and see your life from My perspective. Viewed from above, the obstacle that frustrated you is only a light and momentary trouble. Once your perspective has been heightened, you can look away from the problem altogether. Turn toward Me and see the Light of My Presence shining upon you." * (Don't know about you, but I relate to the 'sleepwalking' and 'lashing out' parts

I love the solutions.)

You know, I'm wondering whether reading this book could help us to make changes we've been yearning for? And, what if it could be a brilliant tool to help us, not only as individuals--but as a community, to be "Hearing God's Call" and "Growing in Love and Care" (our Mission)! A mission says why we are—our purpose. A vision grows out of this and says, "Given our mission, purpose, what is God calling us to do?" Are we beginning to have a vision at FCCW--that God is calling us to--in the near future? We have decisions to make. Our mission aptly says we will go to God and listen. We have some history using a "team synergy" approach involving lots of communication with each other, and we want to plan some team synergy meetings. Here are some questions to think about.

How are you hearing God's call in your life? What challenges are you having concerning growing in love and how might the church help? Are you beginning to have some visions regarding what God is calling us to do? Look, listen for inklings. While we are in the organizing stages of this, let me suggest that if you are interested--begin to read "Jesus Calling"* As you read, at least sometimes, allow your imagination to wander and ask the Holy Spirit for new pictures, images, dreams and ideas? Even seemingly silly and unusual things may be clues as we entertain them for a moment. I believe this is a powerfully inspired and inspiring book and could help us with discernment. It turns our minds to God's perspective in a bright, positive, immediate and heart-opening way. It can help create "space" in our thinking—space for new thoughts and ideas.

If you are interested reading this book with me and asking Spirit to guide us, please let me know. We can find a time to meet and share. And, may we pray, opening ourselves to all which God is calling us to and seeking to grow in love and care of each other through all. Amen.
