The "Special" of the Day A Reflection by Donna V Ackerman

John 1:14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

As many of you know, George and I recently traveled over 4,000 miles in nine days staying in eight different hotels. The reason for this journey to Colorado and back was to collect our son's dog so that Georgie could begin his rehabilitation treatment. Our average driving was ten hours a day. We woke each day comforted in the knowledge that your traveling prayers were with us. We would say our own prayer and begin our day with the expectation of what would be our "special" of the day. We would reassure ourselves that each day was an adventure and one we had not experienced before. To keep or minds occupied we counted things. One of our daily specials was a big-rig trailer full of Christmas trees which we estimated to be over 100 of them. We decided they were on their way to NYC to be sold in a Manhattan tree-lot. Another was a fence row of small tv satellite dishes painted with a variety of colors and designs. Not sure about the message, but it was different and brought us joy. As winds spread unsightly garbage along the highway, somebody decided to place empty bottles and cans on tree branches and shrubs. I've seen this kind of display in people's yards but never on the side of the road in the middle of nowhere. As creative as this was, it occurred to us that the effort was wasted because the trash was still cluttering the environment.

My favorite "special" was the miles and miles of wind turbines. These stately sentinels slowly turned their massive blades manufacturing electricity for our midwestern neighbors. I am a big fan, no pun intended, of wind turbines. Each time we crested another hill it was breath-taking to see these majestic feats of engineering casting shadows upon the fields of corn. One special of the day involved a truck load of what looked like lobster pots. This of course was strange since we were in the Kansas prairies. Upon closer inspection we discovered that each container was holding about ten or so ring-necked pheasants, and there seemed to be about fifteen to twenty containers. I didn't want to think about where they were being shipped to.

Of course, most of our day was spent counting hawks and other God's creatures. Our best hawk-sighting-day resulted in spying 70 of them. Their white breasts basking in the rays of the sun. We also were blessed to see a coyote, eagles, geese and other migrating birds, and George's favorite, an abundance of deer. We had, cranberry turned to mango sunrises, and sunsets. And on our last leg of our journey, we were greeted with the sight of a hotair balloon rising in a brisk 28* morning.

The season of Advent begins the anticipation of the birth of Christ. We celebrate and contemplate the gifts God has given us. We share with family and friends the blessings of being together and the many "Specials" set before us.

Lord, thank you for the season of Advent as we seek out the "Special" of the day. You have already given us Hope, Joy, Peace, and Love. Help us to see that these are the true "Daily Specials".

2022 ALTERNATIVE GIFT GIVING PROGRAM

Alternative gift giving is giving in recognition for the person who has everything to benefit the people who don't. We have an opportunity this Christmas season to consider a gift to any of five worthy programs.

The Feddern Diaconate Discretionary Fund provides temporary emergency assistance to individuals and families in need within our church and within the community.

Heifer International provides livestock and training to individuals or families in need to increase income, food security, and nutrition with a pass it on philosophy. Each person who receives an animal passes on the first offspring to another person/family in need. You can purchase shares of goats, chickens, pigs, rabbits, llamas, buffaloes, heifers and other animals.

Zimbabwean Child Sponsorship makes education a reality. Signs directed to community members in several schools say "Stop early marriage. Give us school fees, not husbands." The sad reality is that orphaned girls have had a limited "career path." Sponsorship provides school fees, uniforms, school supplies to the most disadvantaged and changes the trajectory of their lives.

Daisy Dube Supplemental Food Program provides protein (soya chunks, fish, meat, eggs, peanut butter, etc.) to 18 children living in an orphanage, helping to combat hunger and malnutrition. Having food gives children a sense of worth and freedom of worry about what they will eat or if they will eat.

Re-usable Sanitary Supply Project

Girls miss a week of school each month due to lack of sanitary resources. Washable, reusable sanitary pads provide a sense of dignity and empowerment and allows girls to stay in school.

Alternative Gift Giving 2022

Our members and friends have a long history of sharing their resources with others during the Christmas season.
