

World Day of Prayer – March 5



World Day of Prayer is a worldwide, ecumenical movement of Christian women of many traditions who come together to observe a common day of prayer each year, and who, in many countries, have a continuing relationship in prayer and service. It is initiated and carried out by women in more than 170 countries and regions. It is symbolized by an annual day of celebration observed on the first Friday in March to which all people are welcome. It brings women of different races, cultures, and traditions together in fellowship, understanding, and action throughout the year. Through World Day of Prayer, women affirm that prayer and action are inseparable and have immeasurable influence in the world. The motto of World Day of Prayer is "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action."

This year the women of the World Day of Prayer Committee of Vanuatu call us to worship with the words, "Build on a strong foundation," inspired by Matthew 7:24-27. In the teachings of Jesus, he talks of the love of God, our neighbor, and ourselves meaning if we want to be forgiven, we need to forgive; if we want to be understood, we need to understand; and if we desire love, we need to first love. Jesus says everyone who hears my words and acts on them will be

like a wise man who build his house on rock.

If we practice these teachings in our homes, communities, and nation, our world will be transformed. When we build a strong foundation in our lives and experience a pandemic as with Covid-19 or unrest in our communities, like the protests of Black Lives Matter, it may feel as if our world in on sandy ground, but the women of Vanuatu assure us that our lives and God's creation is build on a strong foundation.

In January, Carol Lundgren, Chuck Hodsdon & Buddy Dee attended (by ZOOM) 3 Webinars, designed for Houses of Worship, sponsored by the State of New Hampshire Department of Public Health. The first of these covered fire prevention, safe egress of the church, basic first aid, AED and COVID protocols. I am happy to report that FCCW is doing extremely well in all categories. We have an early detection fire alarm system installed. We are current with our local Fire Department inspections and Permits (thanks Julie M.) We have multiple ways to exit the church and we inform the congregation at every gathering. The one improvement we CAN do is to use more outside lighting when the church is being used after dark. First Aid and AED's—We are doing better than other churches as we have multiple correctly stocked First Aid kits, trained and certified First Aid, CPR and AED volunteers. The AED is current with everything that is needed in one carry case. Of the 3,000 Houses of Worship in the State of NH, less than 200 have an AED. That is something to be proud of! COVID-The speaker, Tricia Tilley from the Department of Public Health spoke about how the Houses of Worship are the hardest hit during this pandemic and would probably be the last to be recommended to be fully open with normal activities. The good news is FCCW has followed the State's recommendations for online services, limited occupancy, wearing of masks, hand sanitizing, social distancing, records for contact tracing, and staying away if you're not feeling well. Public health recommendations have been changing regularly as more is learned about COVID and the success of vaccinations. The State is looking for 70% compliance to be reached before things are back to normal. I am looking forward to worshipping, singing and the fellowship of coffee hour.

Book Review

<u>Gentle Closings --</u> <u>How to Say Good Bye to Someone You Love,</u> by Ted Menten

This is a small book, but it's packed with beautiful brief stories. Written in 1991 it maintains the universal relevance we 'sense' when thinking about dying - either for ourselves, a loved one or someone admired who receives a diagnosis that will lead to certain death. And isn't it ironic? We are all on that path! If you are like me, you have some reservations about dying and probably do not wish to spend much time in thought about your own end of life. But someone else's ending ... well, that's a different story. And though this book is chock full of stories, they are all sweet, insightful, honest and revealing of our shared conclusion. It's worthy of your time!

Zimbabwe News

Zimbabwe remains on a soft lockdown with only movements for essential services, i.e. food and medical attention. Vendors have are working from their homes (barbers, hairdressers, mechanics) or coming to your home while masked or selling while walking. Police can and will harass shop owners on one day and be lenient on another. People are tired of struggling to earn a few dollars each day in an already dysfunctional economy. Zimbabwe has received 200,000 doses of the vaccine from China. In a population of 15 million, government officials and health care workers are among the first to receive the vaccine.

Schools are expected to reopen in mid-March. Students attended school formally for about two months in 2020. As anticipated the national end of years exams were dismal for Grade 7 as so many do not have access to any type of online learning. Some Form 4 and Form 6 students took advantage of "extra lessons" offered privately and are awaiting their results.

FOOT and PKZ sponsored students now number 42! We make sure our sponsored students have access to extra lessons and food during the lockdown. We found ways to continue to deliver the monthly supplemental food to the children at Daisy Dube Children's Home. Distributions of food for the elderly, dresses, medical and school supplies have been paused as the team waits for lockdown restrictions to be lifted. The team looks forward to installation of a new borehole once rainy season ends.

Rufumiso Pastor and Mrs. Gwaygwaya welcomed their first child, a girl, in January. This December photo shows them standing near the uncompleted parsonage which we started working on in 2014. The Rufumiso congregation may gather with 30 or less with masks, temperature checks, hand sanitizer and social distanc-



ing protocols in place. Everyone wonders when things will return to 'normal' and they continue to place their trust that God has not forsaken us. Indeed.
